I hope there are not many who sneer at the conquest of science as materialistic avenues to the betterment of human conditions. A spiritual civilization is not necessarily one of poverty and disease, man drawn rickshaw and the handcart. It is the thing to say that wisdom is more precious than rubies and the wise man is happy whatever befalls him and quite another to hold that poverty and ill-health are necessary for spiritual advance. While poverty is spiritual when it is voluntary, the mass poverty of a people is a sign of sloth and failure. Our philosophy of life recognizes the production and increases of wealth among the legitimate aims of human endeavor. Pursuit of wealth does not, itself, spell spiritual ruin. It is a means, in itself ethically colourless, neither good nor evil, but a necessary means for the attainment of higher life for the individual and the mass of mankind. What counts is the purpose for which wealth is striven after. So long as we realize that it is a means to a higher end, we can boldly venture out on the path of the conquest of Nature's secrets and their utilization for man's service. There are so many ills that flesh is heir to which need not be met by fatalism and folded hands. Instead of facing suffering and disease by apologetic justification of the ways of God to man, nobler piety demands their reduction and ultimate removal.

On August 15, 1947, India was granted independence from British colonial dominance. This was an event of international significance. From this day onwards, the Indian Union assumed a role in world politics that was appropriate enough to modify the thinking of nations. Concepts like non-alignment, tolerance, non-violence and peaceful co-existence were introduced by India into the international vocabulary.

"Our dreams concern India", said the first Prime Minister of the country, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, on the eve of achieving freedom, "but they also concern the whole world, for the world has become one."

Mahatma Gandhi chose Nehru to become the first PM of independent India. With his vision of unity of the nation, he became the architect of modern India. It was to be a federal state based on secularism—the commitment to an Indian identity which was above all races, castes and religions. It was a vision of extraordinary dimensions.

Both Nehru as well as his daughter and successor, Smt. Indira Gandhi, were well aware that only a firm anchorage in the Indian identity could unite the nation and enable it to make an impact on the world. In these days
