#### SECTION 1 ENGLISH LANGUAGE (4Q x 5M = 20 MARKS)

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions given in this section.

Colonel Aponte understood then that they could not wait any longer and he ordered Father Amador to do the autopsy. "It would be worse digging him up a week later," he said. The priest had studied medicine and surgery at Salamanca, but had entered the seminary before he was graduated, and even the mayor knew that his autopsy would have no legal standing. Nevertheless, he made him carry out the order.

It was a massacre, performed at the public school with the help of the druggist, who took notes, and a first-year medical student who was here on vacation. They only had a few instruments for minor surgery available and the rest were craftsman's tools. But despite the havoc wrought on the body, Father Amador's report seemed in order and the investigator incorporated it in the brief as a useful piece of evidence.

Seven of the several wounds were fatal. The liver was almost sliced in pieces by two deep cuts on the anterior side. He had four incisions in the stomach, one of them so deep that it went completely through and destroyed the pancreas. He had six other lesser perforations in the transverse colon and multiple wounds in the small intestine. The only one he had in the back, at the level of the third lumbar vertebra, had perforated the right kidney. The abdominal cavity was filled with large clots of blood, and in the midst of the morass of gastric contents appeared a medal of the Virgin of Carmel that Santiago Nasar had swallowed at the age of four.

The thoracic cavity showed two perforations: One in the second right intercostal space that affected the lung and another quite close to the left armpit. He also had six minor wounds on his arms and hands, and two horizontal cuts: one on the right thigh and the other in the abdominal muscles. He had a deep stab in the right hand. The report says: "It looked like a stigma of the crucified Christ." The encephalic mass weighed sixty grams more than that of a normal Englishman, and Father Amador noted in the report hat Santiago Nasar had a superior intelligence and a bright future.

Nevertheless, in the final note he pointed out a hypertrophy of the liver that he attributed to a poorly cured case of hepatitis. "That is to say," he told me, "he had only a few years of life left to him in any case." Dr. Dionisio Iguaran, who in fact had treated Santiago Nasar for hepatitis at the age of twelve, recalled that autopsy with indignation. "Only a priest could be so dumb," he told me. "There was never any way to make him understand that we tropical people have larger livers than greenhorn Galician Spaniards."



## SECTION 6 ESSAY WRITING (8Q x 10M = 80 marks)

This section, with four sub-sections, contains 12 questions out of which the student has to answer any <u>eight by selecting at least one question from each sub-section</u>. All questions carry equal marks (10). The answer to each question should not be less than 1 page (approx.300 words). Answers must be written in the answer booklet itself. You can choose to answer any <u>two</u> essays in <u>Bangla</u> or <u>Hindi</u>.

Criteria for evaluation: clarity of thought, brevity of expression, originality of ideas, knowledge of facts, and style of language. Your answers must reflect your specific viewpoints based on media reports and your understanding of the larger socio-economic and political context.

Sub-section 1 - Society

- 1.1 We are becoming increasingly dependent on machines and computers even to carry-out our day-to-day activities. Is this dependence good or bad? Give examples to prove your arguments.
- 1.2 Younger billionaires, greater emotional stress, work-life balance, disjoint families, single parents... to what extent has the traditional role of men and women changed in the last 10 years in the context of changing professional lifestyle and personal habits? How do you think this will affect the life of future generations? Give examples.
- 1.3 Should sex education be introduced at the high school level for students, given the alarming rise in teenage pregnancy? Is this problem a result of Western influence on Indian society? Or, is it a case of new-found human freedom?

#### Sub-section 2 - Current Affairs

- 2.1 Should euthanasia be given the status of a fundamental right if the means to live ceases to exist? Should there be a law governing euthanasia? Give your opinion in the context of Aruna Shanbaug's plea in the Supreme Court, and the Court's decision.
- 2.2 Comment on the recent uprising in Egypt, Libya and Islamic nations in the Middle East. Is this the end of dictatorship in the world?
- 2.3 Give an outline of Radia-gate. Who is Niira Radia? Why was she in the news? How have businessmen and politicians reacted to phone-tapping by the government? Is Ratan Tata justified in objecting to his conversations with Niira Radia being made public? What was the role of prominent news editors in this entire episode?

#### Sub-section 3 - Media

- 3.1 For the media to be effective, news should always be investigative and sensational in nature. Do you agree? How would you adapt to the 'trial by media' environment, as a student of mass communication, and deal with it? Explain in the context of the Aarushi murder case or the 2G spectrum scam.
- 3.2 Discuss how social media tools have changed the way we communicate at the social, interpersonal and corporate levels. Take specific examples of LinkedIn, Facebook and Twitter. Why are colleges and companies banning the use of social media on their campuses?
- 3.3 Is brand loyalty a myth in today's marketing scenario? Has intense competition, pricesensitive consumers, high inflation and an explosion in organized retail destroyed customer loyalty to a specific brand? Give examples.

#### Sub-section – Sports:

- 4.1 In the current edition of ICC World Cup Cricket, which match did you enjoy the most and why? Which Indian player in your opinion was a consistent match-winner? Which team according to you has the best chance of winning the World Cup, and why?
- 4.2 On the basis of the medals India won at the Commonwealth Games 2010 and the subsequent Asian Games in China, would you say that India has arrived as a sporting nation? Which areas do you think need improvement in Indian sport? Give specific examples and comment.
- 4.3 Do you think women have been given their due in any sporting event in India? Take examples of sports or games that Indian women excel in and compare them with sports or

games that women from other countries excel in. Do you think you can link social and economic conditions in India to women excelling in sports and games? Give specific reasons.
