HEROES



"I now realise I have rope burns on my palms as a result of drawing water for hours," says Irfan Ansari, "But I am glad we were able to bring the fire under control." Ansari and his 'fireman' comrades Abdul Hannan and Waris Khan are the heroes of their hutment colony in Kasaiwada, Kurla.

When the colony caught fire at about 12.30 pm on Saturday due to a short-circuit, they were the ones who came to the rescue. As the fire raged, fire rangers were unable to navigate through the narrow lanes to reach the spot.

Meanwhile, a gas cylinder burst, aggravating the inferno. By the time the fire was brought under control, 200 hutments had been destroyed and five people were critically injured.

"I came up with the idea of fetching water from the small well as the fire rangers were helpless," says Hannan, "we asked all the other people to help."

"I am left without a house now," says Khan, "but I am happy that God fulfilled my earnest desire to stop the fire from spreading to other houses and destroying them." It took three hours for the residents to extinguish the fire.

Niket Kaushik, deputy police commissioner of Zone 6, says, "After the cylinder explosion, we informed the Railways traffic control room to divert trains if required, as the colony is situated close to the tracks."

"We have accommodated those who lost homes at a nearby school," local MLA Nawab Malik says," and are looking after their food and other everyday needs." I will see to it that the government gives them Rs 1,000 per head as compensation, along with blankets and other relief materials, as soon as possible." Of the five injured, Iqbal Husain sustained injuries in his eye and Sattar on his hand. They have both been admitted to Sion Hospital.


